2017 Secretary's Report

General

The world of electronics continues to expand and provide benefit to more and more of the world's population. On the surface you think it would be easy to give away money but someone with Ross's knowledge, contacts, determination and persistence is needed to bring it all together each year. The two recipients of the 2017 \$500 sponsorships are Moana Uesile (Auckland) and Callum Thompson (Christchurch). Both students have demonstrated significant improvements in their performance, over the past year by dent of hard work.

The Institute extends its appreciation to the Spark Foundation for making the video conference facilities available free of charge.

Once more, my thanks to Ross Muir and Ralph Boshier for their continuing assistance and wisdom throughout the course of the year.

Financial

For the third straight year the Institute managed to show an operating surplus. Principally this was on the back of substantially improved collection rates for both current and in arrears subscriptions and despite the \$1 000 of sponsorship awards falling in period. An improvement in interest rates also helped the cause. Thank you all.
